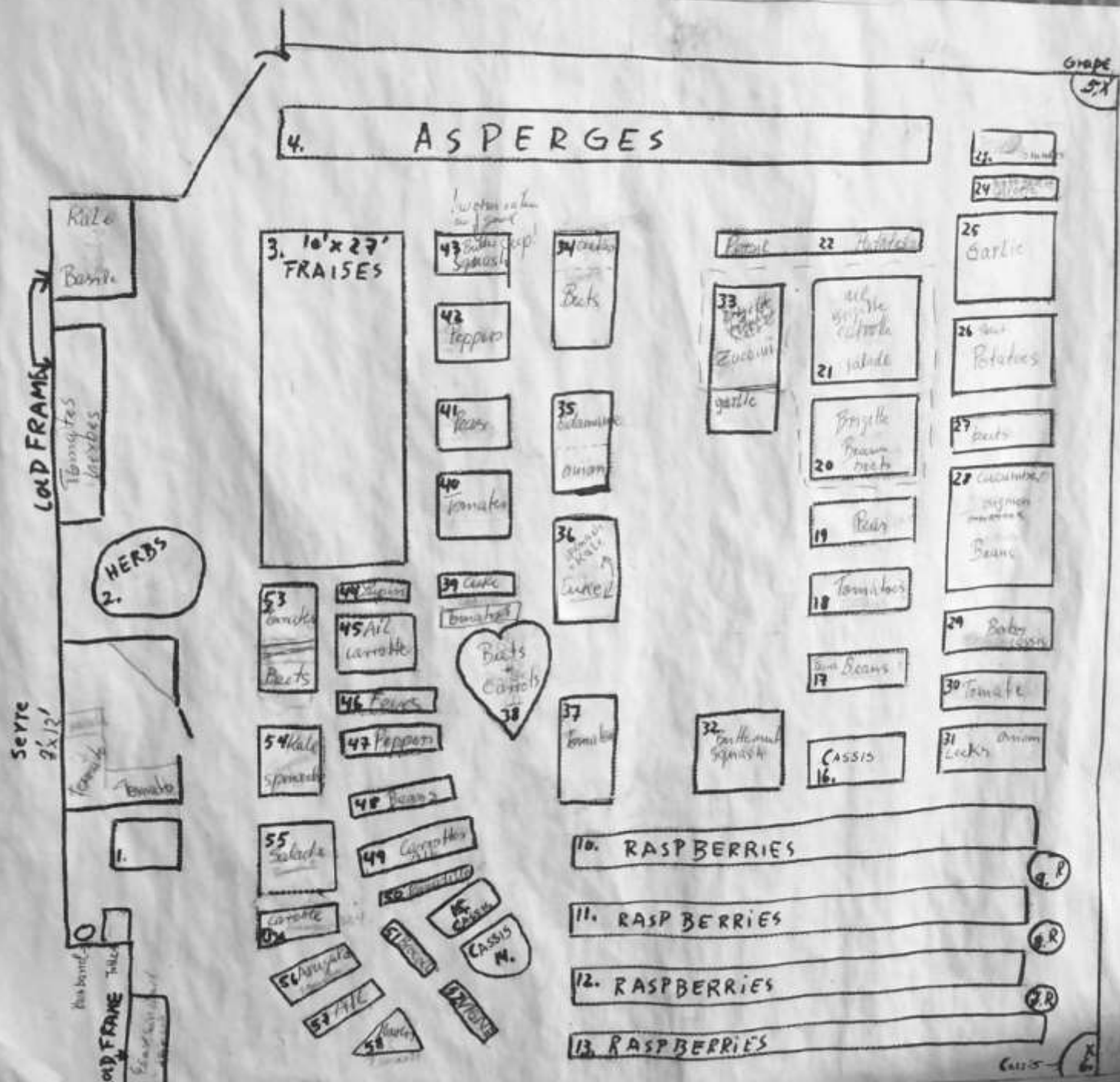

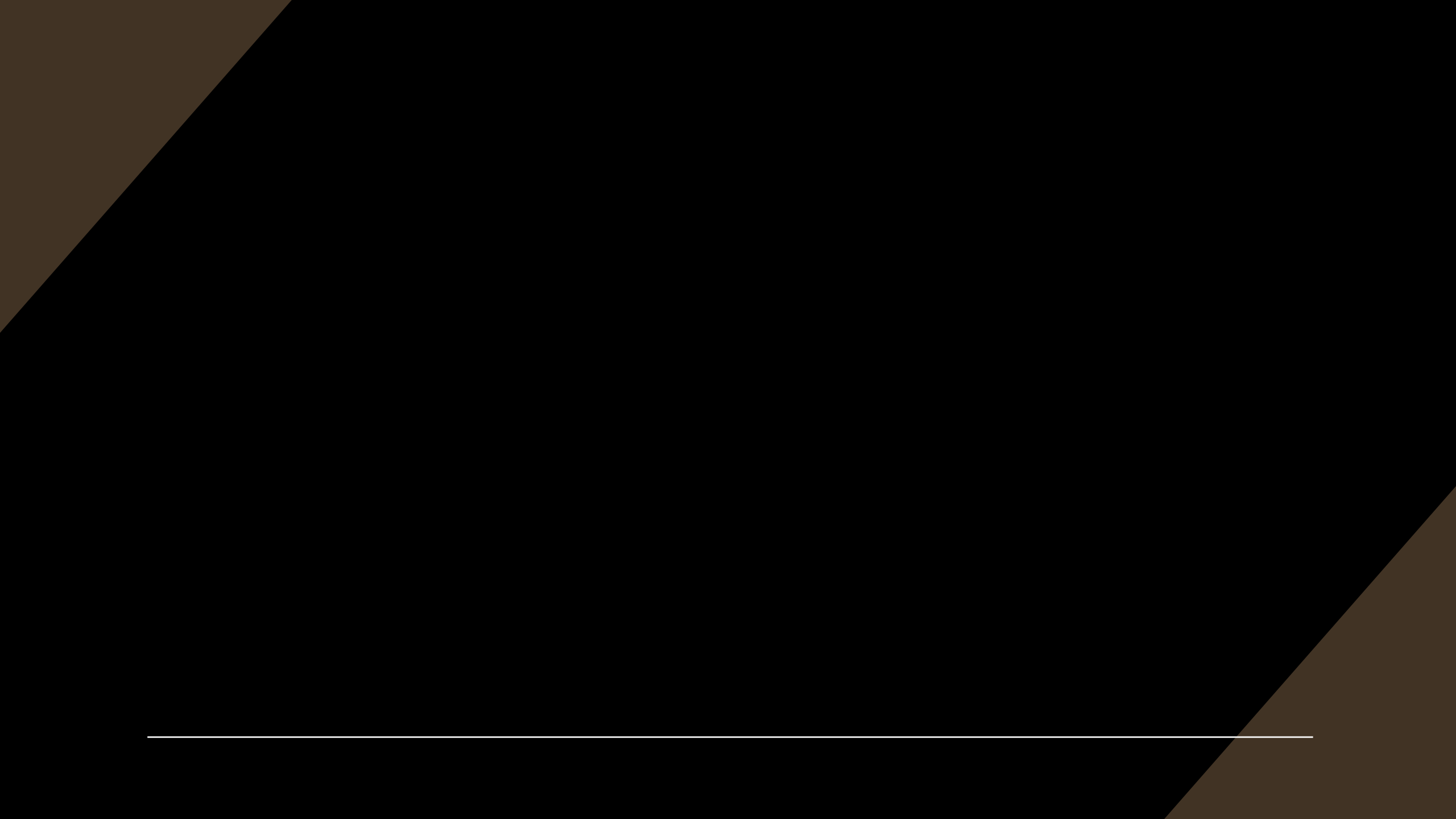

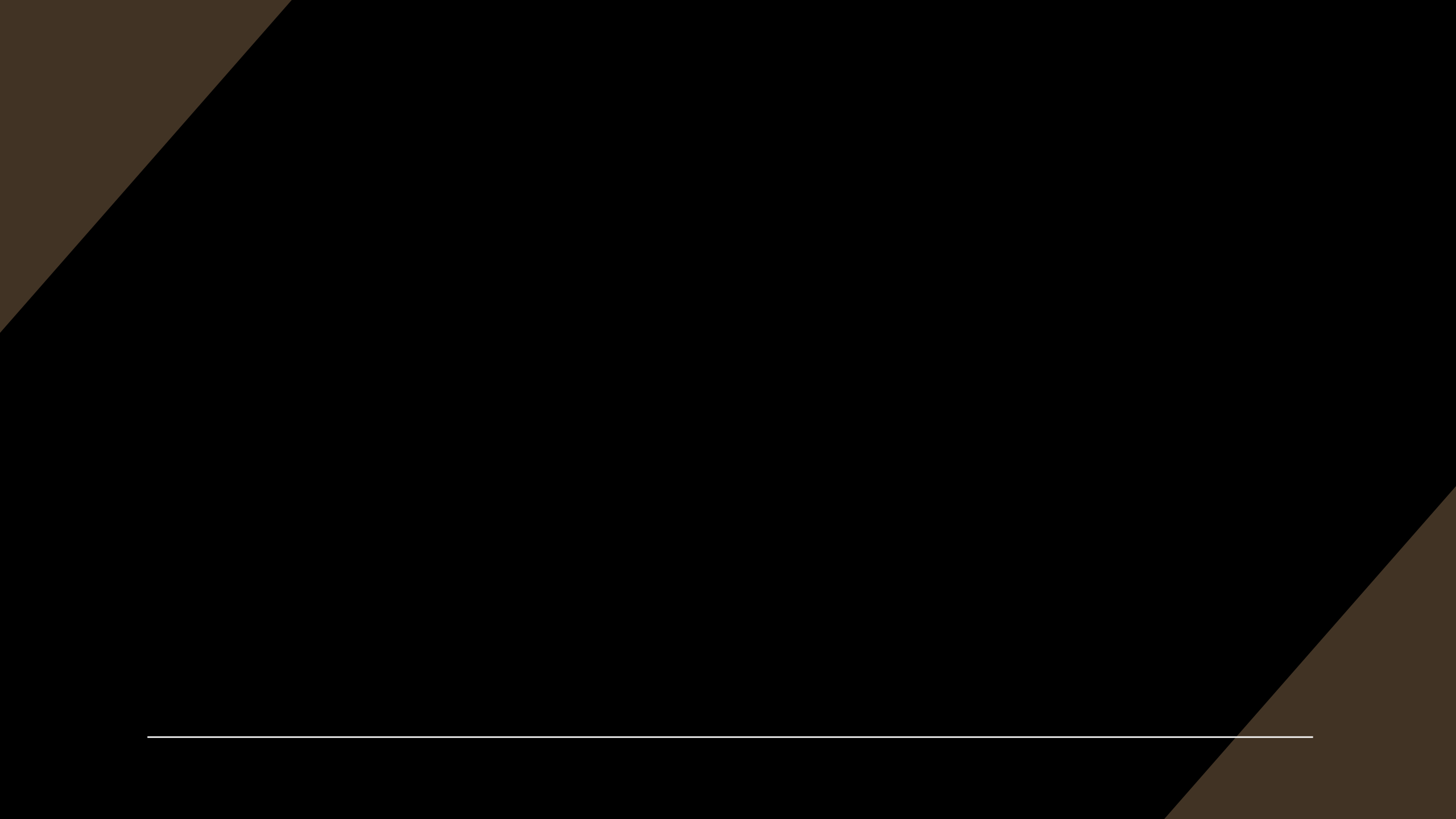


Almo Katar

A tale of history and imagination

New children's book builds story around Senneville Iroquois massacre of 1689

... was the inscription on the bronze plaque that inspired Hilary Hedges.

The British-born poet and writer ... returning daily to the site of the plaque commemorating the Iroquois massacre of 1689 located on Senneville Rd. in Senneville.

... she was especially taken with the message that read: "Eighteen Iroquois were killed in the skirmish. Three were taken prisoner while one man to safety ..."

After several visits to "contemplate what that bit of history must have been like," Hedges was inspired to write a book.

... *Senneville Time Warp*, a mystery story for young people, will hit book stores in less than two weeks.

... "I'm really very pleased with the book," Hedges said. "We were able to take an important piece of local history and turn it into a story that I think is a pretty good story

for children."

Hedges teamed up with Senneville artist and photographer Atmo Zakes to put out the book. The pair also used three local children and one adult to play the principle roles in the story. The book is illustrated with photographs of local people in familiar places playing the roles.

"Hilary wanted the story to appear as real as possible, which is why we chose local children to be involved," Zakes said. "It's a book with children for children."

Hedges and Zakes portray a pair of characters in the book as well.

Anna and Emma are two sisters living in Senneville. They're very excited because their 12-year-old niece, Christabel, portrayed by Vicky Dunster of Senneville, is visiting them from England.

It's there that the story begins.

Christabel reluctantly teams up with Mark, a young boy portrayed by David Crevier Robbins. The two set off on an adventure where they meet Old Peter, portrayed by Jim

Shea.

Old Peter tells them: "You will make a third friend. And you will travel this summer a long, long distance. Farther than anyone has ever been before. Almost."

The two kids eventually go back in time to the 1600s, where they do indeed run into a new pal — Little Feather, portrayed by Carl Crevier Robbins, David's brother.

"It's really quite an intriguing story," Hedges said. "We don't want to give too much away, but I hope young people will enjoy it."

David Crevier Robbins, 9, of Ste. Anne de Bellevue enjoyed being part of the project and posing for the photographs.

"It felt fun," he said. "I read the book and liked it. I really liked the part when we said goodbye to Little Feather."

The German-born Zakes, who has lived in Canada for 30 years, likes the theme of the story for a number of reasons.

"It's good because the girl is the heroine," she said. "Very often in children's books it's a man or a boy who is the hero. It's good to break the stereotypes and prejudices.

"The story will really get the reader to use their imagination," Zakes continued. "There are a lot of different twists."

A book launching party will take place Sunday from 2 to 4 p.m. at 292

Senneville Rd.

Everyone is welcome to come meet Hedges, Zakes and the other characters in the book.

Après le massacre de Lachine, en août 1689, des bandes d'Iroquois continuèrent à semer la terreur dans le voisinage de l'île de Montréal, sans provoquer de réaction de la part des autorités de la colonie. Ce ne fut qu'au milieu d'octobre que le gouverneur Denonville envoya Dulhut et d'Ailleboust de Manthet en éclaireurs, accompagnés de 28 cadets. Au lac des Deux Montagnes, ils tombèrent sur un parti de 22 Iroquois en canot. Ils en tuèrent 18, trois furent fait prisonniers et un se sauva à la nage. Ce premier succès redonna confiance aux habitants de la colonie.

Following the Lachine massacre in August 1689, the Iroquois continued to terrorize the Montreal area. In October, Governor Denonville sent out a scouting party of 28 under the Sieurs Dulhut and d'Ailleboust de Manthet which came upon a party of 22 Iroquois in the lac des Deux Montagnes. In the mêlée that followed this surprise encounter 18 Iroquois were killed, three taken prisoner, while one swam to safety. This victory did much to restore the shaken confidence of the inhabitants.
